Contra Costa College Professor Laura Lozano Elected to I-CAR Board of

Directors

Contra Costa College (CCC) Collision Repair Program Lead Laura Lozano, has been elected to the I-CAR Board of Directors, representing the Education segment in a national leadership role. Her three-year term began on August 27.

I-CAR (Inter-Industry Conference on Auto Collision Repair) is a national nonprofit that sets education and



training standards for the auto collision industry. The Board plays a key role in shaping programs that support technicians, educators, and industry partners nationwide.

Lozano's election highlights CCC's strong industry connections and commitment to career-focused education. Her new role with I CAR expands that influence to the national level. At I-CAR, she'll represent all educators working to keep collision repair programs current, connected, and student-focused.

Lozano attended CCC as a student in the Automotive Collision Repair Technology program. After earning her associate degree, she worked in the field, co-opened an auto body shop with her father, and returned to CCC to lead the very program that launched her career.

"Being elected to the I-CAR Board feels like a culmination of everything this program stands for: hands-on learning, industry partnership, and supporting student success. I'm honored to bring Contra Costa College's voice to such a vital table," said Lozano.

He also had a roundtable discussion with students enrolled in an "Intro to Politics" class. Students asked thoughtful questions about how to effect change in our world. Rep. DeSaulnier encouraged them to stay civically engaged, pay attention to what's happening in their community, and have conversations with people who have different points of view.



Los Medanos College Obtains Fire Engine for Fire Academy

Los Medanos College Fire Academy students are getting a big boost this year with the arrival of a fully loaded 2009 Hi-Tec Type I Fire Engine—ready to roll and ready to train on!

Thanks to funding from the California Strong Workforce Program, LMC was able to purchase the \$114,000 engine from the Cordelia Fire Protection

District. Outfitted with gear for both urban and wildland firefighting, this truck is a huge win for the college. To put it in perspective, a brand-new model without any equipment would have run close to \$800,000.

"This acquisition significantly enhances our training capabilities, providing our students with hands-on experience and is an important component in preparing them for real-world firefighting scenarios," Fire Academy Coordinator **Joe Torres** said.

Students in the Spring 2026 Fire Academy will be the first to put the fire engine to use after completing their prerequisites.

Catch the big red engine as it makes its debut in the City of Pittsburg Holiday Parade on Saturday, Dec. 6!
