ADMISSIONS

- Applications for admission to any college of the District must be completed prior to course enrollment.
- 2. Colleges of the District may admit students who are not California residents and those students will be required to pay non-resident tuition. Nonresident students will be required to pay a capital outlay fee.
- 3. Students exempt from selected matriculation services will be permitted to enroll in classes. Students classified as non-exempt from matriculation services are encouraged to participate in orientation, assessment testing, and counseling prior to enrolling in classes.
- 4. K-12 students must submit a completed Concurrent Enrollment form signed by parent/guardian and school principal or designee, in addition to completing an application for admission.
 - K-12 students enrolled in private or public school must submit a completed Concurrent Enrollment form signed by parent/guardian and school principal or designee.
 - K-12 students enrolled in home school must complete the Concurrent Enrollment form signed by parent/guardian and submit a copy of their California Private School affidavit.
- 5. College admission policies and procedures are available in student-directed publications such as catalogs, schedule of classes and student handbooks.
- 6. Students who are over 18 years of age and who do not possess a high school diploma may be admitted to a District college when the Governing Board determines the student(s) may profit from the instruction available.
- 7. The residency state of each student applying to a District college is determined at the time of application. Students who have been determined to be nonresidents at the time of their application may be eligible for residency reclassification or fee exemption.
