EMERGENCY CARE

Emergency care² is for medical or mental health conditions that require immediate medical attention to prevent serious jeopardy to your health, such as:

- Chest pain or pressure
- Severe stomach pain that comes on suddenly
- Decrease in or loss of consciousness
- Severe shortness of breath
