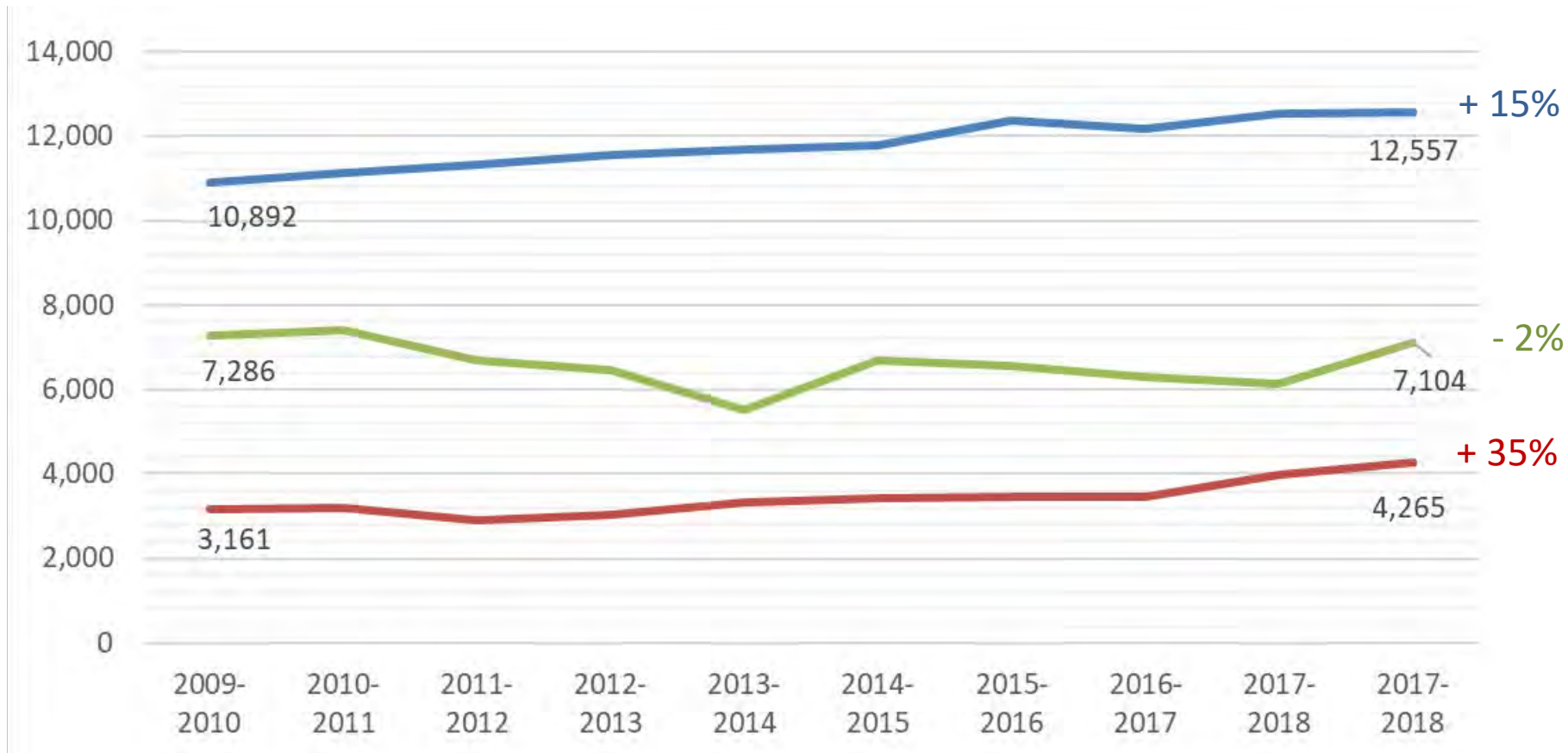

Trends in High School Enrollment

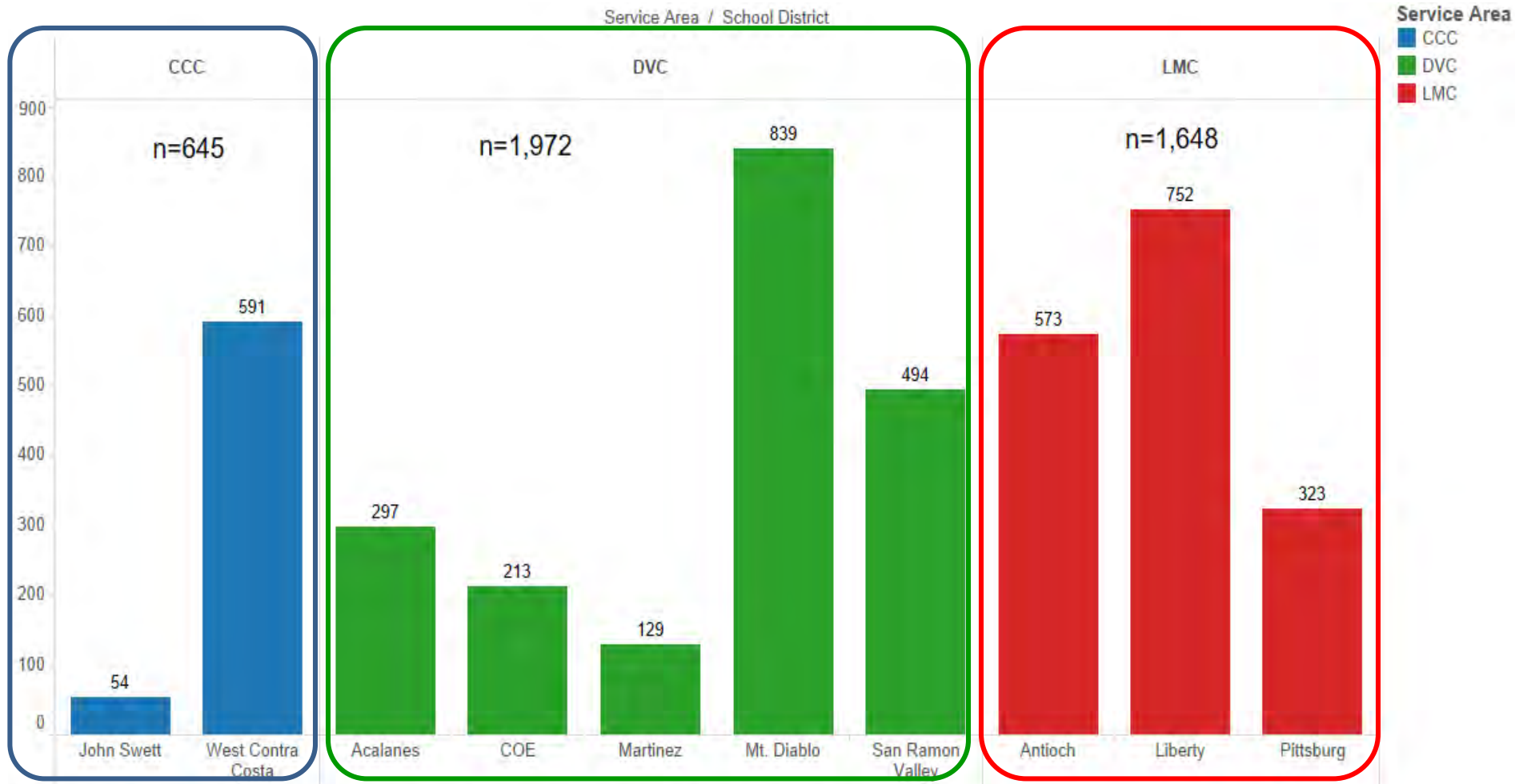

 — HS Grads Enrolling at 4CD colleges

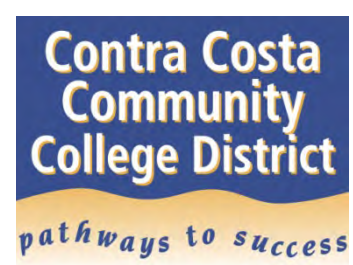


Graduates from Feeder High School Districts

Number of 2017-18 High School Graduates from County Districts Attending 4CD in 2018-19



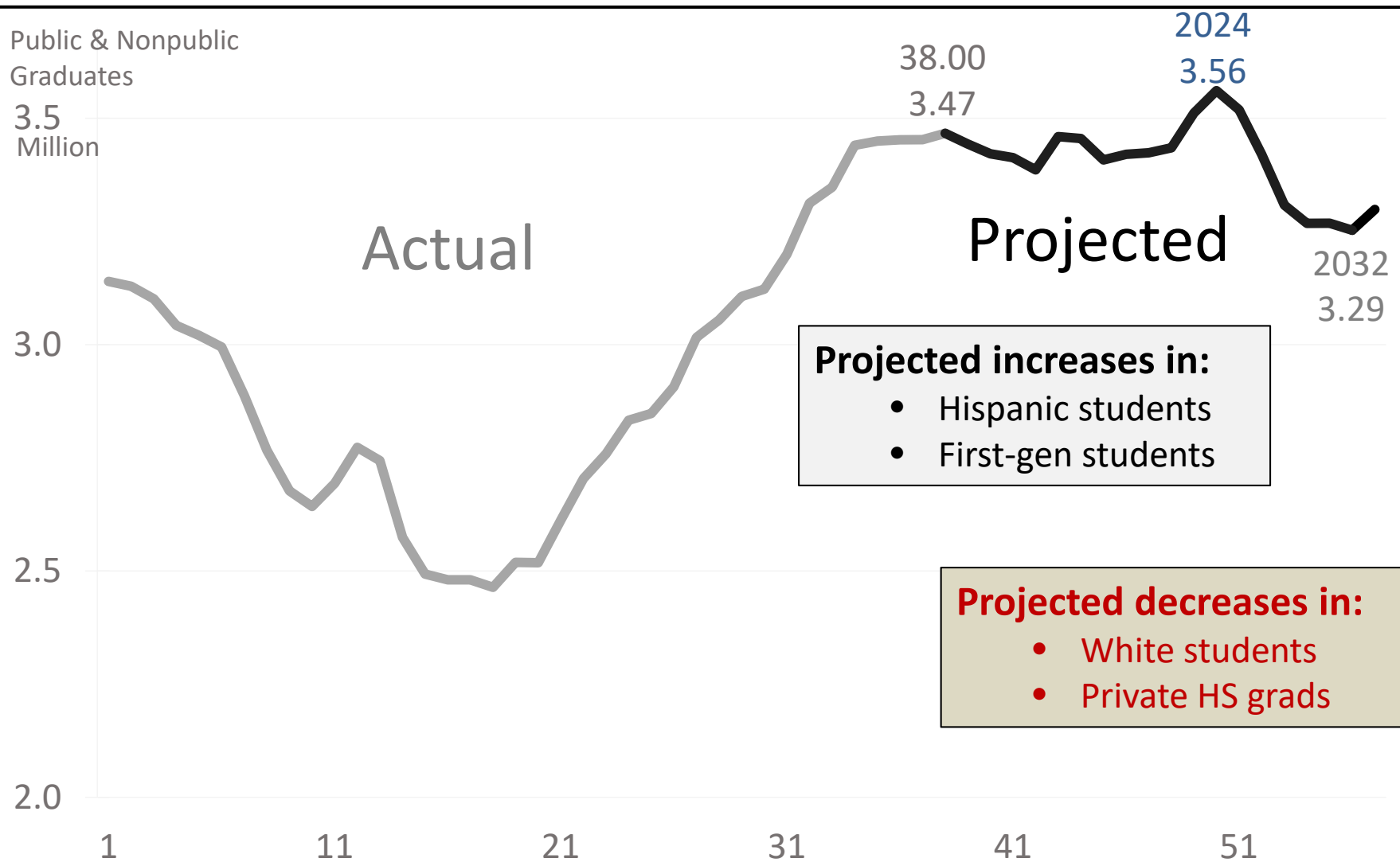
Distinct student count for each School District broken down by Service Area. Color shows details about Service Area.

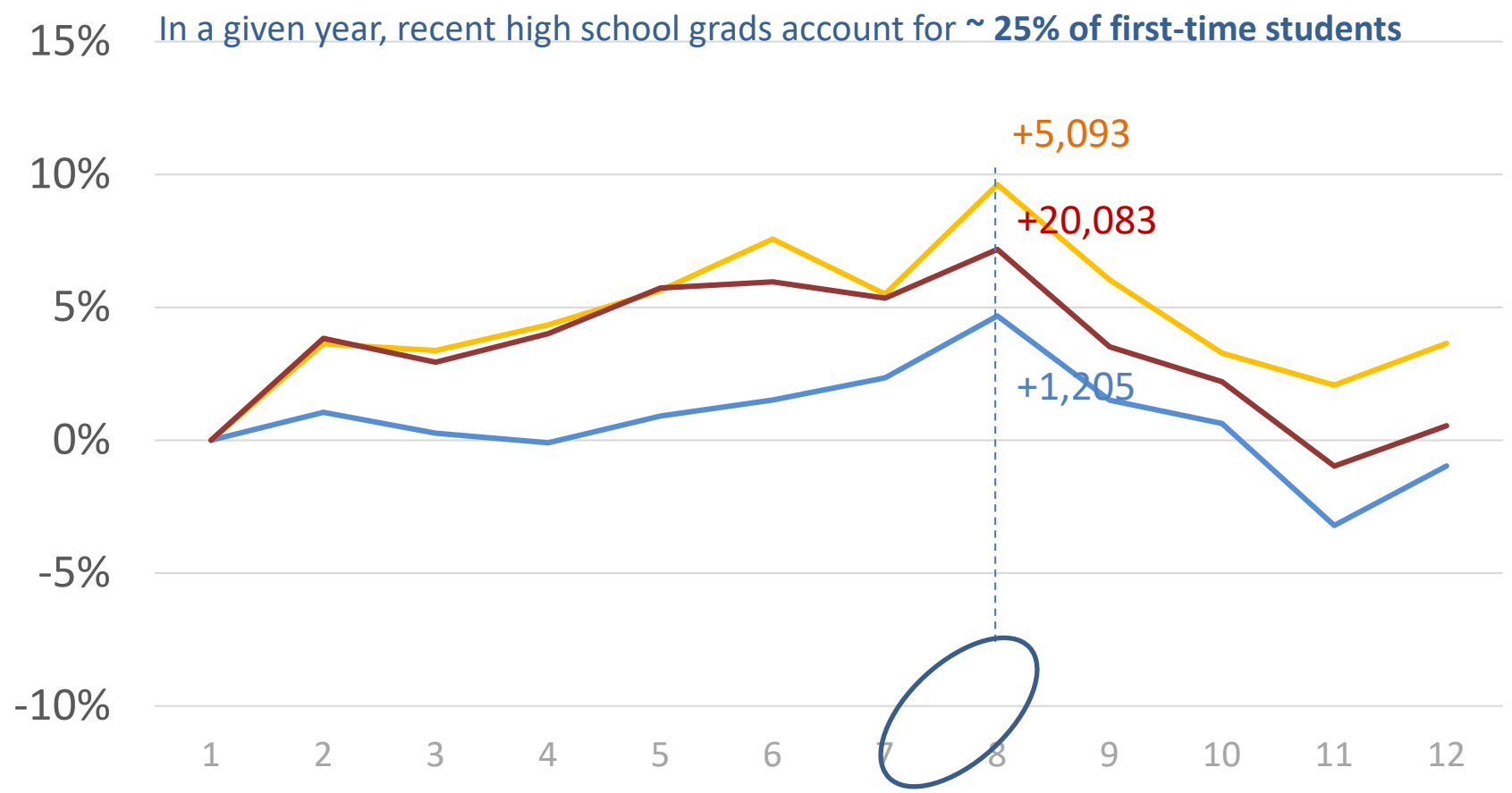
U.S. High School Graduates (1976 – 2032)

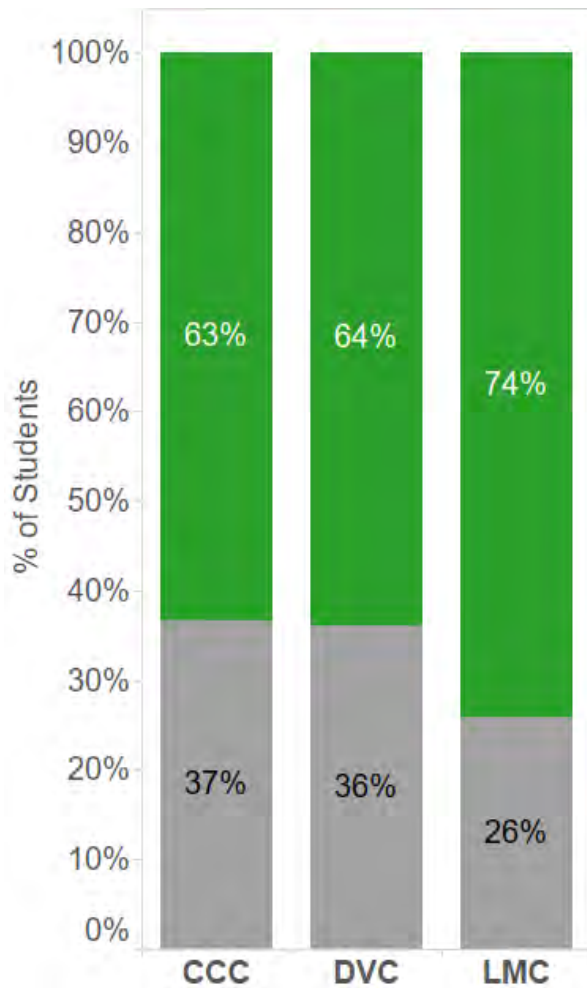




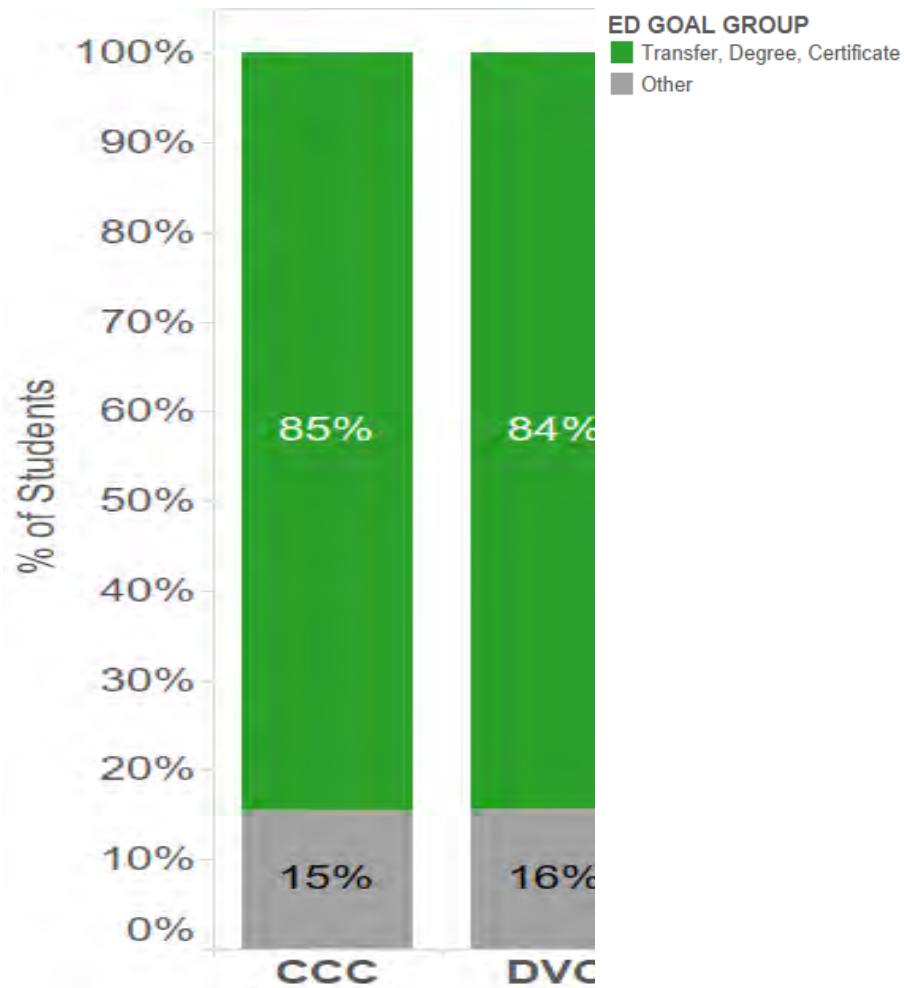

Educational goals of feeder HS graduates by service area

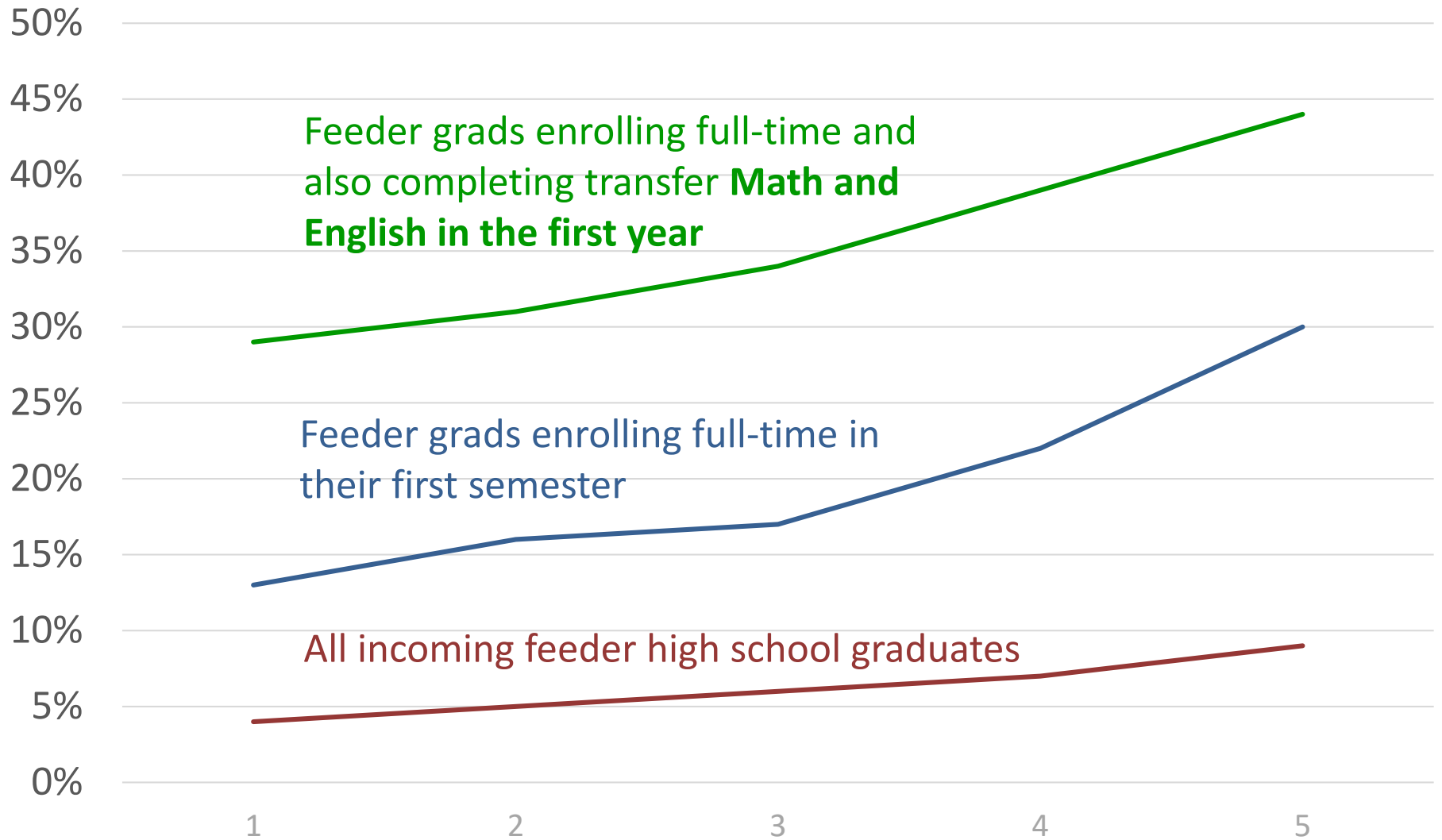
Original Ed Goal



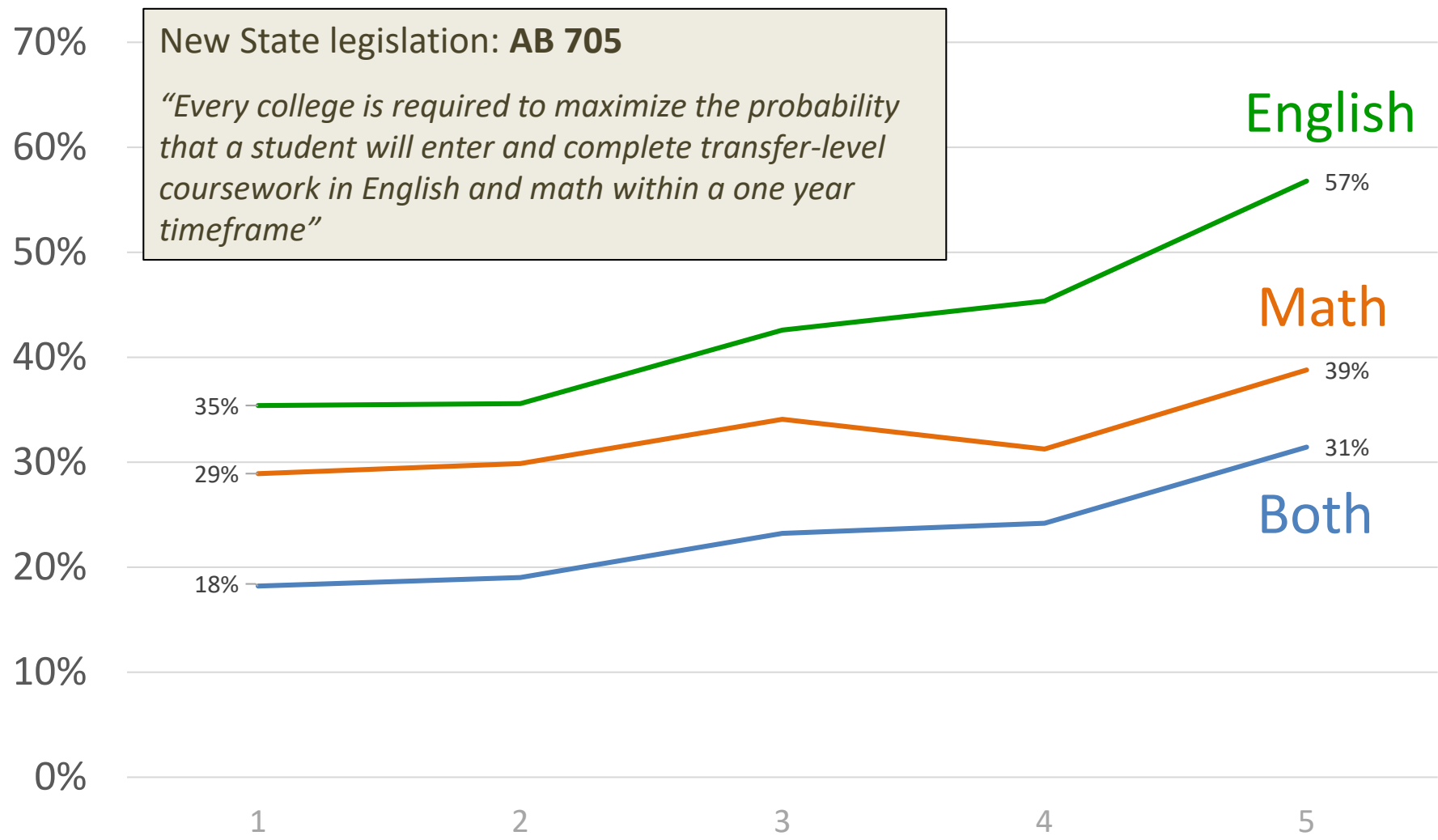
Current Ed Goal

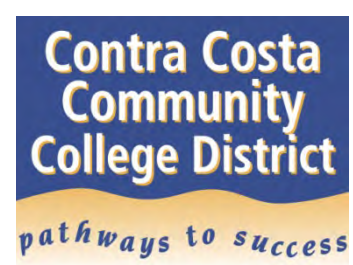


Percent of feeder high school students getting a 4CD credential within 3 years *(transfers not included)*

College strategies to capture high school graduates

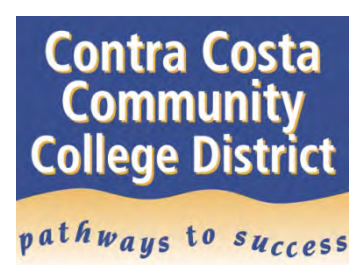
HS outreach activities at the colleges
